We seek 2D and 3D entries in any medium for exhibition and/or digital projection for use during the Annual Conference of the United Methodist Churches of Indiana and for a virtual online gallery. Submissions may also include videos and audio recordings.

Please note: The audience for this in person event and virtual online gallery may include children, adolescents, and adults of diverse backgrounds and communities. A team will review all submissions, as we are not interested in graphic depictions of violence.

Description of the Art Gallery

Explore the profound intersection of art and advocacy at our gallery, aimed at raising awareness about the profound impacts of gun violence, while instilling hope and advocating for peace. The gallery will showcase works from artists that convey powerful messages of resilience and the urgent call for change. Through their artistry, these creators challenge us to speak out against gun violence, while uplifting the spirit and transformative power of peacemaking. Submission Guidelines:

1. Fill out and submit "Artist Submission Liability Release Form 2024".
2. Provide digital images of work, along with a high resolution image (minimum 2000 pixels across)
3. Provide dimensions of 2D/3D work or type of file.
4. Provide title, medium, and a brief description of the work's relationship to the themes outlined in the description above.
5. Optional: Provide a personal story of how gun violence has impacted your life.
6. Optional: Provide artist's statement.
7. Provide bio and contact information.
